General George W. Casey, Jr.

Career Summary:

General George W. Casey, Jr. served 41-years as an American soldier following his commission as a second lieutenant of Infantry from Georgetown University School of Foreign Service in 1970. He is an accomplished leader and an authority on strategic leadership.

As the 36th Chief of Staff of the US Army from April 2007 to 2011, General Casey led what is arguably the world's largest and most complex organization — 1.2 million people, with a \$200+ billion annual budget — during one of the most extraordinary periods in military and global political history. He is widely credited with restoring balance to the war-weary US Army, leading the transformation to keep the Army relevant in the 21st Century, and ensuring the force deployed in the war on terror was the best this country ever fielded. On the home front, General Casey took on the tough issues of suicide, combat stress and reducing the stigma attached to mental health care. He was also a stalwart advocate for military families, wounded Soldiers, and survivors of the fallen.

Prior to this, from July 2004 to February 2007, he commanded the Multi-National Force – Iraq, a coalition of more than 30 countries. General Casey guided the Iraq mission through its toughest days, driving significant change in the US Armed Forces and building the Iraqi security institutions while battling a difficult insurgency and sectarian violence.

He currently serves as a Distinguished Senior Lecturer of Leadership at the SC Johnson College of Business, Cornell University, and lectures internationally on leadership at other business schools and to the leadership of numerous business organizations.

He also teaches international relations at the Korbel School, University of Denver.

General Casey holds a Masters' Degree in International Relations from Denver University and he served as a Senior Fellow at the Atlantic Council of the United States, a foreign policy think-tank. Born in Japan, he served in operational assignments in Europe, the Balkans and the Middle East. He has broad international experience.

He has published two books since leaving the Army, <u>Strategic Reflections</u>, <u>Operation Iraqi Freedom</u>, <u>July 2004-2007</u>, about his experience in Iraq, and <u>Supporting Veterans—After 50 Years of the All-Volunteer Force</u>, and several articles on leadership, including, "Leading in a 'VUCA' World", Fortune <u>Magazine</u>.
